Transport: private cars

Rendezvous: Behind (Jura side) of the Nyon Gare at 7h50 for an 8h00 departure (From Geneva take the 7:29 train – arr Nyon 7:43.)

On arrival in Zinal at about 10:00 we will have a quick coffee at the Hôtel Restaurant Europe (027 475 4404). Then we will drive to the end of the road.

To bring: **snowshoes (initially attached to your backpack)**, hiking boots, warm clothing, hat, picnic, water, sunscreen, sunglasses, collapsible hiking poles, headlamp (optional). (An ice axe & crampons might be useful TBD.)



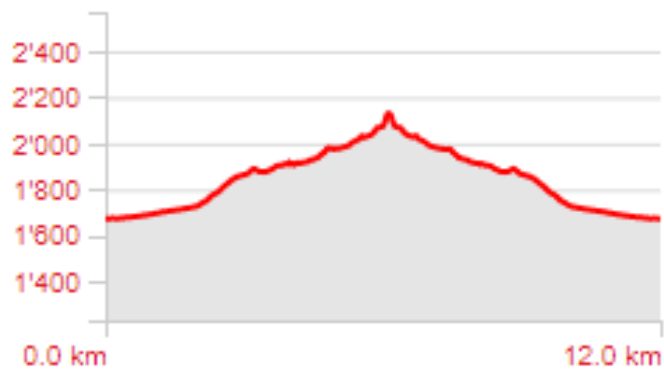
Price: 5 CHF, 15 CHF for non-members
